- 1. What does the history of salvation tell us?
 The history of salvation tells us how God saved us.
- 2. How do we know about God?
 We know about God
 because he made himself known to us.
- 3. How did God make himself known to us? God made himself known to us through his holy Word in the Bible.
- 4. What is the Bible?

 The Bible is the written story of God's actions in the world.

5. What are the Gospels?

The Gospels are the written story which tells us about the words and actions of Jesus Christ.

- 6. What did Jesus tell us about God?

 Jesus taught us that in the one God there are three Persons,

 Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.
- 7. What is the mystery of the Holy Trinity?
 The mystery of the Holy Trinity
 is the one true God in three Persons
 —the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.
- 8. What did Jesus teach us about the Father?

 Jesus taught us to love
 our heavenly Father
 because he loves us
 and wants to help us,
 and to bring us to his heavenly home.
- 9. What did Jesus teach us about himself?

 Jesus taught us that he is the Son of God
 who became man to save us.


10. What did Jesus teach us about the Holy Spirit?

Jesus taught us that the Holy Spirit is the third Person of the Blessed Trinity, whom the Father and he sent to his Church.

11. How do we honor the Blessed Trinity? We honor the Blessed Trinity when we pray to God— the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit— who lives in our soul by grace.

- 12. How has God shown his love for us? God has shown his love for us by making us that we may serve him: by sending his Son to save us from sin: by loving and caring for us as a loving Father
- 13. How do we show our love for God? We show our love for God by worshiping him.
- 14. How do we worship God? We worship God by doing all that he wants us to do: by praying to him; by offering ourselves to him through Jesus in the Mass.

15. Why do we worship God especially in Holy Mass?

We worship God especially in Holy Mass because in Holy Mass Jesus offers himself to his Father, as he did on the cross, but he does not suffer anymore. He gives God the highest honor.

16. Why did God put us in this world?

God put us in this world to know and love him; to serve him by keeping his commandments; to get ourselves ready for the happiness of heaven.

17. From whom do we learn to know, love and serve God?

We learn to know, love and serve God from Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who teaches us through the Catholic Church.

18. How do you know God?


I know God by my faith in the teaching of the Catholic Church.


19. How do you love God?

27. Who is your Guardian Angel?

My Guardian Angel is the good angel God gave me to take care of me and to lead me to heaven.

28. How do you show your love for your **Guardian Angel?**

I show my love for my Guardian Angel by praying to him and listening to him when he tells me to be good.

29. What is man?

Man is a creature with a body and a soul, made to the image of God.

 Man is made to the image of God
 because he has a soul,
 and, like God, he can know and love.
- 31. Who were the first man and woman?

 The first man and woman were

 Adam and Eve.

God gave Adam and Eve
the great gift of sanctifying grace,
which made them children of God
and gave them the right to heaven.

33. Who made you? God made me, with the help of my father and mother.

34. Why did God make you? God made me to show his goodness and to make me happy with him forever in heaven.

35. What must you do to be happy with God in heaven?

To be happy with God in heaven I must know him, love him, and serve him in this world.

Part Three - JESUS CHRIST

4 JESUS CHRIST, SAVIOR AND REDEEMER OF THE WORLD

- 36. What does the incarnation mean?

 The incarnation means that Jesus Christ, the Son of God, the second Person of the Blessed Trinity, became man and came to live among us.
- 37. Why did the Son of God become man?

 The Son of God became man
 to bring us his own divine life
 and to save us from sin.

38. How does Jesus Christ give us his divine life?

Jesus Christ gives us his divine life through his sanctifying grace, which makes us holy.

39. When did the Son of God become man?

The Son of God became man when God sent the angel Gabriel to ask Mary to be the Mother of his Son, and she said "Yes."
Then God sent his Son to her by the power of his Holy Spirit.

40. When was Jesus born?

Jesus was born on the first Christmas Day, more than nineteen hundred years ago.

41. Is Jesus Christ both God and man? Jesus Christ is both God and Man— he is the Son of God and the Son of Mary.

42. Why did the Son of God come to live among us?

The Son of God came to live among us to make up for the sins of all people and to help them to gain heaven.

43. What great gift did Jesus come to get back for us?


The great gift which Jesus came to get back for us is sanctifying grace, God's life in us.

44. Why is Jesus called our Redeemer?

Jesus is called our Redeemer because he paid our debt for sin and bought heaven back for us by his suffering and death on the cross, and by his resurrection from the dead.

45. Why did Jesus suffer and die for us?

Jesus suffered and died for us because he loved and obeyed his Father, and because he loved us.

46. What do we mean by the resurrection of Jesus?

By the resurrection of Jesus we mean that Jesus came back to life again on Easter Sunday, three days after he was buried.



Jesus rose from the dead to give us God's life

47. Why did Jesus rise from the dead?

Jesus rose from the dead to show that he is true God and to teach us that we, too, shall rise from the dead, and in him we are made new persons.

48. When did Jesus return to heaven?

Jesus returned to heaven forty days after he rose from the dead.

5 THE HOLY SPIRIT IN THE CHURCH



- 49. Who is the Holy Spirit?

 The Holy Spirit is God,
 the third Person of the Holy Trinity.
- 50. What did Jesus tell us about the Holy Spirit?

 Jesus told us that the Holy Spirit is God and that he would send him from the Father that he might remain with us.
- 51. When did the Holy Spirit come to the Church?

 The Holy Spirit came to the Church on Pentecost Sunday, fifty days after the resurrection of Jesus.
- 52. What does the Holy Spirit do for us? The Holy Spirit makes us holy by giving us his grace.

53. What does the Holy Spirit do for the Church?

The Holy Spirit guides the Church in the truth that it may lead people to eternal life.

6 THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

- 54. Why did Jesus start the Church?

 Jesus started the Church
 to bring all people to eternal salvation.
- Jesus gave his apostles, the first bishops, the power to teach and to guide people to God and help them to be holy.
- 56. To whom did Jesus give special power in his Church?

Jesus gave special power in his Church to Saint Peter by making him the head of the apostles.

- 57. Who take the place of the apostles today?

 The bishops take the place
 of the apostles today
 as shepherds of the Church.
- 58. Who help the bishops in the care of people?

 The priests help the bishops in the care of people.
- 59. Who is the pope?

 The pope is the head of the Church, and takes the place of Jesus on earth.
- 50. What are the gifts of God in the Catholic Church?

The gifts of God in the Catholic Church are: the truths of faith, and the sacraments.

- 61. Who guides the Church and gives it life?

 Jesus guides the Church
 and gives it his own life of grace
 through the Holy Spirit,
 whom he sent to his Church.
- 62. How does the Holy Spirit act in the Church?
 The Holy Spirit acts in the Church especially in the sacraments which Jesus began.

Part Six - THE SACRAMENTS

7 THE SEVEN SACRAMENTS

- A sacrament is a sign that we can see made by Christ to give grace.
- 64. Why did Jesus give his sacraments to the Church?

 Jesus gave his sacraments to the Church to make us holy by his grace, to build up his Church, and to give worship to God.
- 65. How does the Church want us to receive the sacraments?

 The Church wants us to receive the sacraments

often and with faith that we may receive the grace we need to live a better Christian life.

66. What are the seven sacraments called?

1 Baptism, 5 Anointing of the

2 Confirmation, Sick,

3 Holy Eucharist, 6 Holy Orders,

4 Penance, 7 and Matrimony.

67. What is baptism?

Baptism is a new birth as a child of God, the beginning of a new life of God's grace in us.

68. What did baptism do for you?

Baptism washed away original sin from my soul, and gave me sanctifying grace that was lost for us by Adam.

69. What does the grace of baptism help you to do?

The grace of baptism helps me to live as a child of God and to become more like Jesus.




70. What is confirmation?


Confirmation is the sacrament by which those born again in baptism receive now the Holy Spirit, the gift of the Father and the Son.

71. What does Jesus do for you in confirmation?

In confirmation Jesus sends the Holy Spirit to me again and gives me new strength to live a Christian life.

Jesus sends his Holy Spirit to us





73. What is Holy Orders?

Holy Orders is the sacrament by which Jesus shares the work of his priesthood with other menthe bishops, priests and deacons of the Catholic Church.

74. What is matrimony?

Matrimony is a sacrament in which Jesus Christ makes marriage a lifelong, sacred union of husband and wife, by which they give themselves to each other and to him.



8 THE SACRAMENT OF PENANCE

- 75. What is the sacrament of penance?

 The sacrament of penance
 brings us God's forgiveness
 for the sins we committed after baptism.
- 76. What does Jesus do for you in the sacrament of penance?
 In the sacrament of penance
 Jesus comes to forgive my sins
 and brings peace with God
 and with the Church,
 which is hurt by my sins.
- 77. How do you receive God's forgiveness?
 I receive God's forgiveness
 through the priest
 who has the power to take away sin.

78. Why does the priest have the power to take away sin?

The priest has the power to take away sin because Jesus gave that power to his apostles and to his Church in the Holy Priesthood.

79. Why must you be sorry for your sins before they can be forgiven?

I must be sorry for my sins before they can be forgiven because by my sins I have offended God, my Father, and because Jesus suffered on the cross for my sins.

80. What does true sorrow for sin do for you? True sorrow for sin brings back the grace of God if I have lost it by serious (mortal) sin.

81. What must you do if you have committed a serious sin?

If I have committed a serious sin I must receive the sacrament of penance before receiving the Holy Eucharist.

82. How does Jesus help you to be holy in the sacrament of penance?

Jesus helps me to be holy
in the sacrament of penance
because he sends his Holy Spirit
to my soul
with grace and strength
to live a better Christian life
and to keep away from sin.

83. What must you do to receive the sacrament of penance?

To receive the sacrament of penance I must:

- 1. Find out my sins.
- 2. Be sorry for my sins.
- 3. Make up my mind not to sin again.
- 4. Tell my sins to the priest.
- 5. Do the penance the priest gives me.

84. How do you find out your sins?

I find out my sins
by remembering the Commandments of
God,
and asking myself how I have disobeyed
God.



JESUS CURES A PARALYZED MAN

One day some men brought a sick man to Jesus, and Jesus said to him, "My friend, your sins are forgiven."

Some asked, "Who can forgive sins, but God alone?" Jesus knew their thoughts and said, "That you may know that I have the power to forgive sins, I say to this man, 'Get up. Take your mat with you and return to your house."

At once the paralyzed man stood up and walked through the crowd, praising God.

Jesus worked this miracle to show that he could forgive sins because he was God.

The Ten Commandments of God GOD

Did I miss my morning or night prayers? Did I misbehave during Mass?

Did I hate anyone?

- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife

Did I do anything that was really impure?

Was it alone or with others?

Did I willingly keep impure thoughts in my mind?

Did I sin by using impure words?

Did I sin by looking at or reading anything impure?

Did I sin by talking about or listening to anything impure?

BE HONEST

- 7. You shall not steal.
- You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Did I steal anything?

Did I keep anything that did not belong to me?

Did I damage what belongs to someone else?

BE TRUTHFUL

8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Did I tell any lies?

Did I tell mean things about anyone?

Did I like to listen to unkind talk about others?

A SHORT ACT OF CONTRITION

Lord, I believe in you: increase my faith.

I trust in you: strengthen my trust.

I love you: let me love you more and more.

I am sorry for my sins: deepen my sorrow.

I ask your help: never let me offend you again.

An Act of Contrition explained

O my God, I am heartily sorry I am really sorry with all my heart.

for having offended You,
I have hurt God by my sins.

and I detest all my sins,

I hate my sins because they hurt God and Jesus, who died for me.

because of your just punishments, I do not want to make God punish me either in this world or in the next.

but most of all, because they offend you, my God, who are all-good

God never gets tired of being good to me. He is as good as he can be, and my sins hurt him.

and deserving of all my love.

God should have all my love because he loves me.

I firmly resolve,

I really promise to try to keep from sin.

with the help of your grace

When I want to do what is right, God helps me.

Grace is the name of the help God gives me.

to sin no more

I do not want to sin again

and to avoid the near occasions of sin.

I want to stay away from any persons, places, or things that easily get me to sin.

85. How do you make your confession?

I make my confession in this way:

- 1. I make the sign of the cross.
- 2. I tell the priest when I made my last confession.
- 3. I confess my sins.
- 4. I listen to what the priest tells me.
- 5. I say the act of contrition.
- 6. I thank the priest.

86. What do you do after confession? After confession I say the penance the priest has given me, and I thank God for forgiving my sins.

87. How often should you go to confession?

I should go to confession as often as I can

—even every month—

if I really love God

and want to get the grace

to keep away from sin.

9 THE HOLY EUCHARIST

- 88. What is the Holy Eucharist?

 The Holy Eucharist is the sacrament in which Christ himself, true God and true Man, is really present, offered, and received in a special sacramental way, under the appearances of bread and wine.
- 89. When did Jesus give us the Holy Eucharist?
 Jesus gave us the Holy Eucharist
 at the Last Supper,
 the night before he died.

90. What happened at the Last Supper?

At the Last Supper, when Jesus said, "This is my body," the bread was changed into his body; and when he said, "This is my blood," the wine was changed into his blood.

91. When did Jesus give his priests the power to change bread and wine into his body and blood?

Jesus gave his priests the power to change bread and wine into his body and blood when he said to the apostles at the Last Supper: "Do this in memory of me."

92. What happens when a priest speaks the words of consecration at Holy Mass?

When a priest speaks the words of consecration at Holy Mass, the bread and wine is changed into the body and blood of Christ, given in sacrifice. It is Jesus who acts through the priest.

93. What does Jesus do in the Mass?

In the Mass Jesus gives himself to his heavenly Father, as he did on the cross, but now in an unbloody manner in this sacrament, for he cannot suffer anymore.

94. Why does Jesus give himself to his Father in the Mass?

Jesus gives himself to his Father in the Mass to continue the sacrifice of the cross, to adore and thank his Father, to ask pardon for our sins, and to bring his blessing upon us.

95. What is Holy Communion?

Holy Communion is a holy meal in which we receive the body and blood of Jesus Christ and recall that at the Last Supper Jesus promised to nourish us with himself so that God's life and grace would be available to us throughout our lives.

96. Why do you believe that Jesus gives himself to you in Holy Communion?

I believe that Jesus gives himself to me in Holy Communion because he said, "This is my body. This is my blood," and because the Church teaches that he is present in this sacrament as God and Man.

97. What does Holy Communion do for you? Holy Communion gives me Jesus, and also the grace I need to love God and all people, and to live a holy life as Jesus did.

98. Why does Jesus live in your soul after Holy Communion?

Jesus lives in my soul after Holy Communion

because he promised:
"He who eats my flesh
and drinks my blood,
lives in me and I in him."

99. How can you get ready to receive Holy Communion?

I can get ready to receive Holy Communion

by following the prayers of the Holy Mass with devotion, and by saying my own prayers to Jesus.

100. What prayers can you say before Holy Communion?

Before Holy Communion I can tell Jesus that I believe in him, hope in him, and love him with all my heart, and that I am truly sorry for my sins.

101. What prayers can you say after Holy Communion?

After Holy Communion I can thank Jesus for coming to me, tell him how much I love him, and ask him to help me and my family and all other people.

102. Why should you receive Holy Communion at every Mass?

I should receive Holy Communion at every Mass because Holy Communion is a sacrament —an important part of the Mass and because Jesus will give me the grace I need to become more like him in my daily life.

Part Seven - THE SINS OF MAN

10 THE FIRST SIN

- 103. What is sin?
 Sin is disobedience to God's laws.
- 104. What does sin do?
 Sin offends God
 and brings his punishment upon us
 and shows that we do not love him.
- 105. What happened to the bad angels?

 The bad angels disobeyed God
 and were cast into hell by the good angels
- 106. Who committed the first sin on earth?

 Adam and Eve, our first parents,
 committed the first sin on earth.

- 107. How did Adam and Eve sin?

 Adam and Eve disobeyed God
 by eating of the forbidden fruit.
- 108. What is the sin of Adam and Eve called?

 The sin of Adam and Eve is called original sin,
 because it is passed on to us through our "origin" from Adam.
- 109. How is original sin passed on to us
 Original sin is passed on to us
 because we are born
 without grace in our souls.
- 110. What happened to Adam and Eve because of their sin?

Because of their sin Adam and Eve lost sanctifying grace and the right to heaven, and were driven from the Garden of Paradise.

111. What punishments come to us through original sin?


Through original sin the punishments of Adam come to us: we must suffer, fight against evil, and die.

112. What must we have to get to heaven? To get to heaven we must have

the great gift of God—sanctifying grace.

113. What did God promise?

God promised to send a Savior,
Jesus Christ, his Son,
to make up for the sin of Adam and Eve
and our own sins,
and to get back for us
the gift of sanctifying grace.

11 OUR OWN SINS

- 114. What is actual sin?

 Actual sin is any sin which we ourselves commit.
- 115. How many kinds of actual sin are there?

 There are two kinds of actual sin:
 mortal and venial sin.
- 116. What is mortal sin?

 Mortal sin is a serious offense against the law of God.
- 117. Why is this sin called mortal?

 This sin is called mortal because it takes away sanctifying grace, God's life in our soul.

We commit mortal sin? We commit mortal sin when we break a SERIOUS commandment of God, and KNOW what we are doing, and WANT to do it.

- 119. What does mortal sin do to us?

 Mortal sin makes us enemies of God and robs our soul of his sanctifying grace.
- 120. What is venial sin?


 Venial sin is a less serious offense against the law of God.
- 121. Does venial sin displease God?

 Venial sin displeases God,
 weakens our love for God
 and shows that we do not love him as we
 should.
- 122. Does venial sin break our friendship with God?

Venial sin does not break our friendship with God or rob our souls of his grace.

123. Will God forgive all our sins?

God will forgive all our sins
if we are truly sorry for them
and try to keep from committing them
again.



Part Eight - THE LIFE OF GRACE

12 THE NEW LIFE IN THE SPIRIT

- 124. What is sanctifying grace?
 Sanctifying grace is a gift of God by which our soul shares in the very life of God.
- 125. How do we share in God's own life?
 We share in God's own life
 by faith, hope, and love.
- 126. What is faith?

 Faith is a gift of God
 by which the Holy Spirit helps us
 to accept God's word and to give
 ourselves to the heavenly Father.

127. What is hope?

Hope is a gift of God which helps us to know that God loves us and cares for us, and that we can trust in him.

128. What is love?

Love is a gift of God which helps us to love God, and to love all people for the love of God because they too belong to him.

129. What does grace do for us?

Through grace the Holy Spirit makes us holy and pleasing to God and helps us to live as children of God.

130. Is grace also God's gift of himself?

Grace is also God's gift of himself because the Holy Spirit unites us with God by love and lives in our soul as in a temple.

131. How long does sanctifying grace stay in our soul?

Sanctifying grace stays in our soul as long as we do not lose it by committing a mortal sin.

132. What other kind of grace does the Holy Spirit give us?

The Holy Spirit also gives us actual grace.

133. What does actual grace do for us?

Actual grace gives light to our mind, and strength to our will to do good and to avoid evil.

134. How can you keep from committing sin? I can keep from committing sin:

1. by praying,

2. by receiving the sacraments often,


3. by remembering that God is always with me and that I am a temple of the Holy Spirit,

4. by keeping busy with work and play,

5. by fighting temptation at once,

6. by staying away from whatever might lead me to sin.

13 THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF GOD

- 136. What must we do to show that we love God?

 To show that we love God
 we must obey everything that Jesus has
 commanded,
 and believe all that he has taught.
- 137. What is the greatest commandment of God?

The greatest commandment of God is to love him with all our heart and all people for his sake. 138. What are we commanded by the first commandment of God?

The first commandment is:

I, the Lord, am your God. You shall not have other gods besides me.

We must not put anyone or anything in place of God.

139. What are we commanded by the second commandment?

The second commandment is:

You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.

We must always speak with reverence of God and the saints.

140. What are we commanded by the third commandment?

The third commandment is:
Remember to keep holy the sabbath day.
We must worship God on Sunday
by assisting at the Holy Sacrifice of the
Mass.

141. What are we commanded by the fourth commandment?

The fourth commandment is: Honor your father and your mother. We must love and obey our parents. 142. What are we commanded by the fifth commandment?

The fifth commandment is:

You shall not kill.

We must take good care of our health and help others to do the same.

143. What are we commanded by the sixth commandment?

The sixth commandment is:

You shall not commit adultery.

We must be pure in our words and actions.

144. What are we commanded by the seventh commandment?

The seventh commandment is:

You shall not steal.

We must respect what belongs to others.

145. What are we commanded by the eighth commandment?

The eighth commandment is:

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.


We must speak the truth in all things.

146. What are we commanded by the ninth commandment?


The ninth commandment is: You shall not covet your neighbor's wife. We must be pure in thought and in desire.

We must not want to take or to keep

Part Ten - MARY AND THE SAINTS


14 MARY THE MOTHER OF GOD AND THE CHURCH

148. Why should we honor the Blessed Virgin Mary?

We should honor the Blessed Virgin Mary by showing her our love and devotion as the Mother of Jesus Christ, and the Mother of the Church, for she is our spiritual Mother.

149. What special gifts did Mary receive from God?

The special gifts Mary received from God are these: she is the Mother of God, she was kept free from original sin, she was taken body and soul to heaven.

 The Church honors the saints because they help us by their prayers and by the good example of their lives.
- We must honor the bodies of those who have died who have died and pray for their souls.

152. What should we look forward to during this life?

During this life we should look forward to our reunion with God.

- 153. What is the particular judgment?

 The particular judgment is the judgment which will be passed on each one of us after death.
- 154. What happens in purgatory?

 In purgatory our soul is made clean before we are able to see God.

155. What will happen at the last judgment?

At the last judgment all of us will stand before the judgment seat of Christ so that each one may receive what he deserves, according to what he has done on earth, good or evil.

156. What will happen to those who have done evil?

Those who have done evil will rise from the dead and will be punished in hell forever.

157. What will happen to those who have done good?

Those who have done good will rise to live an eternal life with God and will receive the reward of seeing him in unending joy.


158. What should we do during our life on earth?

APPENDIX A

THE TEN COMMANDMENTS OF GOD

- 1. I, the Lord, am your God. You shall not have other gods besides me.
- 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord, your God, in vain.
- 3. Remember to keep holy the sabbath day.
- 4. Honor your father and your mother.
- 5. You shall not kill.
- 6. You shall not commit adultery.
- 7. You shall not steal.
- 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.
- 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.
- 10. You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.



In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus spoke of the Beatitudes.

THE BEATITUDES

- 1. Blest are the poor in spirit: the reign of God is theirs.
- 2. Blest are the sorrowing: they shall be consoled.
- 3. Blest are the lowly: they shall inherit the land.
- 4. Blest are they who hunger and thirst for holiness: they shall have their fill.
- 5. Blest are they who show mercy: mercy shall be theirs.
- 6. Blest are the single-hearted: for they shall see God.
- 7. Blest are the peacemakers: they shall be called sons of God.
- 8. Blest are those persecuted for holiness' sake: the reign of God is theirs. (Mt 5:3-10)

DUTIES OF CATHOLICS

Chief Precepts of the Church

- 1. To keep holy the day of the Lord's Resurrection: to worship God by participating in Mass every Sunday and holy day of obligation: to avoid those activities that would hinder renewal of soul and body, e.g., needless work and business activities, unnecessary shopping and so on.
- 2. To lead a sacramental life: to receive Holy Communion frequently and the Sacrament of Penance minimally, to receive the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year (annual confession is obligatory only if serious sin is involved).

- Minimally also, to receive Holy Communion at least once a year, between the First Sunday of Lent and Trinity Sunday.
- 3. To study Catholic teaching in preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation, to be confirmed, and then to continue to study and advance the cause of Christ.
- 4. To observe the marriage laws of the Church: to give religious training, by example and word, to one's children; to use parish schools and catechetical programs.
- 5. To strengthen and support the Church: one's own parish community and parish priests, the world-wide Church and the Pope.
- 6. To do penance, including abstaining from meat and fasting from food on the appointed days.
- 7. To join in the missionary spirit and apostolate of the Church.

NOTE TO PARENTS

EAR parents and teachers, you are privileged to be able to prepare a child of God for first Confession and Communion. At no time in their lives are these children more open to accept the seeds of divine truth which you will give them. So much of their future spiritual life will depend on the way you prepare them for these two important sacraments, because these sacraments can be received frequently in their life-time. You share in the priestly work of Christ the Teacher, and through the Sacrament of Confirmation you have the opportunity to be a witness to Jesus Christ by implanting his truth in the hearts of the children whom he loved so dearly. May this catechism be a worthy instrument to help you do your apostolic work well!

The material of this First Communion Catechism follows the Principal Elements of the Christian Message for Catechesis (Ch. V) and Catechesis for a Worshipping Community (Ch. VI) of *Sharing the Light of Faith* — The National Catechetical Directory for Catholics of the United States, approved Oct. 30, 1978. This is also the source of material I have used in the Primary, Intermediate, and Complete Edition of the St. Joseph *New American Catechism.*

The National Catechetical Directory makes some significant comments on Catechesis for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and First Communion.

"Parents have a right and duty to be intimately involved in preparing their children for First Communion. Catechesis aims to help parents grow in understanding and appreciation of the Eucharist and participate readily in catechizing their children.

"Catechesis for children seeks to strengthen their awareness of the Father's love, of the call to participate in Christ's sacrifice, and of the gift of the Spirit. Children should be taught that the Holy Eucharist is the real body and blood of Christ, and what appear to be bread and wine are actually His living body.

Children around the age of 7 tend to think concretely; they grasp concepts like 'unity' and 'belonging' from experiences, such as sharing, listening, eating, conversing, giving, thanking, and celebrating. Such experiences, coupled with further efforts to familiarize them with the main events of Jesus' life, help them to participate more meaningfully in the action of the Mass and to receive Christ's body and blood in communion in an informed and reverent manner."(122)

"Catechesis of children for Reconciliation must always respect the natural disposition, ability, age, and circumstances of individuals. It seeks, first, to make clear the relationship of the sacrament to the child's life: second, to help the child recognize moral good and evil, repent of wrongdoing, and turn for forgiveness to Christ and the Church; third, to encourage the child to see that, in this sacrament, faith is expressed by being forgiven and forgiving; fourth, to encourage the child to approach the sacrament freely and regularly. Parents should be involved in the preparation of children for this sacrament.

"Catechesis for the Sacrament of Reconciliation is to precede First Communion and must be kept distinct by a clear and unhurried separation. This is to be done so that the specific identity of each sacrament is apparent and so that, before receiving First Communion, the child will be familiar with the revised Rite of Reconciliation and will be at ease with the reception of the sacrament. The Sacrament of Reconciliation normally should be celebrated prior to the reception of First Communion.

"Because continuing, lifelong conversion is part of what it means to grow in faith, catechesis for the Sacrament of Reconciliation is ongoing. Children have a right to a fuller catechesis each year. Lent is an especially appropriate season for this." (126)

Pope John Paul II in his major document (Catechesi Tradendae) discussing catechetical renewal, released Oct. 25, 1979, states:

"Catechesis is an education of children, young people and adults in the faith, which includes especially the teaching of Christian doctrine imparted, generally speaking, in an *organic* and systematic way, with a view to initiating the hearers into the fullness of Christian life.

"Catechetical work must be systematic, not improvised but programmed to reach a precise goal. *It must deal with essentials. . . .* It must be an *integral* Christian initiation, open to all the other factors of Christian life."

In the spirit of the instruction of Pope John Paul II, I have prepared this *St. Joseph New American Catechism Series*, a part of which is this First Communion Catechism. It is a systematic summary of the essentials of Christian Doctrine. A child preparing for First Communion should be put in touch with these essentials at least in a general way in order to be better prepared to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar.

To make this instruction more effective, I recommend to parents and teachers the frequent use of pictures and stories, especially from the Bible. They will find abundant material especially in two of my publications: *Catechism Sketched*, and *Catechism in Stories*.
